## Mission of the Faculty of Dental Sciences

The **Mission** of the Faculty of Dental Sciences is to promote oral health in Sri Lanka. It hopes to do so by being a Centre of high standards of quality in the provision of dental undergraduate and postgraduate training, research in basic and applied sciences in Dentistry and training of Dental Auxiliary Personnel.

#### 1. PURPOSE

- ✓ Take the initiative to keep in contact with your mentors, including during any placement, and seek advice when you need it

- ✓ Use the FDS & MOODLE systems regularly to keep yourself and us informed
- ✓ Inform your teacher or Office as soon as possible of anything which might affect your studies such as absence and obtain advance agreement for any expected essential absence\*
- ✓ Seek help quickly from Deans' Office (FDS), and the Students welfare and advisory committee (SWAC), if you encounter difficulties
- ✓ Take appropriate steps to familiarize yourself with processes, regulations and codes of conduct
- ✓ Show your professionalism and ethical behavior when you dealing with patients
- ✓ Follow infection control and safety methods laid down by the FDS when you work in the clinics and laboratories

- ✓ Inform you of University, faculty plans and proposals with which the Students' Union is involved
- ✓ Represent the views of the student community to the University and the faculty
- ✓ Advise you on any issues you may have with the FDS, and on following procedures and regulations
